

- Manatees only have molars to grind their food.
- Manatees chew two times per second.
- Manatee teeth are constantly being replaced as they wear down and fall out.
- The intestine of an adult manatee can measure 130 feet long.
- Manatees only breath through their nostrils.
- Manatee can hold their breath for up to 24 minutes.
- Manatee lungs are 2/3 the length of its body.
- A manatee cannot turn its head sideways, it must turn its whole body.
- It takes 13 months for a manatee to be born.
- Calves spend two years with their mothers learning the migration routes.


