
## **Animal Care and Life Support Monthly Report**

## JUNE 2019:

- Gamefish Lagoon had a bloom of phytoplankton following a coastal upwelling (see below for description) it lasted from June 7<sup>th</sup> July 1<sup>st</sup>. The GFL has self-regulated now that incoming water is no longer nutrient laden and the water is clear once again
- Resealing quarantine glass tanks. Most of these tanks are well over 10yrs old and their seals are failing, this should take about two weeks to complete **Completed**
- Conducting collecting trips for invertebrates for touch tank etc, larger collection trips will be scheduled for after Chris Britton's paternity leave is complete- **Trips will begin next week**
- Scheduling ray tank cleaning for June- Completed on schedule
- Waiting for Ault to isolate power to the GFL islands and relocate junction box- on going since January- Junction box
  was relocated but breakers have not yet been separated
- We are awaiting gate options for flow control/ backflow prevention at discharge culverts for GFL (currently using wood planks on both sides North and South) we are discharging 50/50 outflow of lagoon through North and South culvert Shaun is working with Murray Logan
- Ocean pump is running well, all alarms are functioning properly Mark, Katie, and Glen have been added to text alert list for Ocean pump power failures so they can be aware of impacts to seagrass cultures
- Protein skimmer pump's basket is being cleaned everyday while we allow the macro algae to grow in and out complete microalgae (this helps the lagoon stay clear)
- Lily and Turtwig are in the main lagoon, Hank is free roam between west turtle pool and main lagoon and Annabelle is housed in east turtle pool
- Sharks are attempting to mate all, day every day, beginning last week.
- A new male Mantis Shrimp has been added to Gal 2 along with a few other critters throughout the exhibit hall
