Drop Off/Pick Up Policy:

- -Drop off is from 8:30 to 9:00am in the parking lot outside of the Coastal Center entrance.
- -If you will be later than 9:00am or your camper will not be attending that day, please call and let us know: 772-233-0011
- -Parent/guardian on the authorized list must sign children in and out with a staff member every day
- -Please bear in mind your child will be missing out on quality experiences if not dropped off on time
- -Parents may car pool if the adult is on camper's list of authorized individuals for pick-up/drop-off
- -Please pick-up children promptly at 3:00pm
- -A photo ID, such as a driver's license, is required to sign out a child
- -A courtesy phone call will be made at 3:10pm if the child has not been picked up, and an additional fee of \$1.00 per minute will be charged after 3:15pm.

Campers should WEAR each day:

- -Closed-toe shoes, such as gym shoes or crocs
- -Camp T-shirt (will be passed out first day of camp)
- -Sunscreen and bug spray
- -Swimsuit (on specified days)
- -Please note: anything worn to camp may get dirty/wet

Campers should BRING each day:

- -Mask, buff, or neck gaiter (please label)
- -Water bottle (preferably a reusable bottle)
- -Lunch and snack for full day camp—Due to allergy concerns with our campers, please refrain from food including peanuts
- -Closed-toe water shoes (not crocs)
- -Hat and/or sunglasses
- -Change of clothes and a towel
- -Bug spray

Do NOT bring valuables or electronic devices to camp (cell phones will be permitted, but will only be used to contact the parent/guardian and will be stored during camp hours)

Cancellation Policy:

Cancellations made more than two weeks prior to your camp session will be refunded, minus a \$25 administrative fee. No refunds will be given if registration is cancelled within two weeks of your camp session.

Camper Conduct:

Campers are expected to obey and respect Florida Oceanographic staff and rules. Campers will respect other camp participants by not using inappropriate language, hitting, pushing, or inappropriately touching other camp participants. The parent or guardian will be notified of any behavioral problems during camp. Serious or repeated misbehavior may result in consequences up to and including dismissal from the summer camp program without refund.

Age Difference in Camp Group:

Campers interested in our 5-7 year old full day camp must have attended kindergarten. If your camper is 5 years old and will be entering kindergarten, they will be welcome to join us for our half day week. Exceptions to the age groupings for sibling campers may be made at the discretion of Florida Oceanographic staff.

Coastal Discovery Summer Camp Reminders KEEP THIS PAGE

Due to COVID-19, our summer camp is going to look slightly different than years past. We are committed to making the experience as close to normal as possible; however we have implemented a few new guidelines and policies to ensure the safety of your campers and our staff.

- -Group Size: All camps will run with a maximum of 18 campers (and 3-4 counselors).
- -Group Stability: All campers must sign up for a full week of camp. Within a given camp week, the same group of children will be interacting with each other every day.
- -Masks for Staff: Staff members will be required to wear a mask or facial covering at all times (except while eating or drinking or underwater).
- -Masks for Campers: All campers will be required to <u>bring</u> a mask or facial covering with them to camp each day. Campers without a facial covering will not be allowed to enter camp that day. A "buff", neck gaiter, or similar fitted facial covering is an acceptable substitute for a mask. <u>Campers will ONLY be required to wear a mask while exploring the FOS Visitor Center (our indoor aquarium and exhibit area), in the Ocean Eco-Center exhibit galleries and classroom (inclement weather, movie time, taking a break from the heat, crafts, etc.), in other indoor locations (possible field trips to indoor facilities), and when riding in the FOS vans. At all other times, mask use by campers is entirely optional. Parents are encouraged to instruct their campers on how and when to wear a mask outside of the required times outlined above.</u>
- -Masks for other Coastal Center visitors (our daily public guests/staff/volunteers): At the current time, all FOS staff members, volunteers, and daily guests are required to wear a facial covering while at the Coastal Center. At the present, the Coastal Center is closed to the public on Mondays and Tuesdays.
- -**Physical Distancing**: We will NOT be requiring strict physical distancing among campers. Florida Oceanographic Society feels that it is not reasonable to expect children to stay physically separated from one another during a fun, exciting, and educational summer camp experience. There will be games, activities, and crafts where campers will be closer than 6 feet from each other.
- -Cleaning: Any indoor surfaces (tables, chairs, etc.) will be cleaned daily after use. Hand sanitizer will be provided for campers to use at any time. We will require hand washing after particularly messy or high-contact activities and before and after eating.
- -Daily health questionnaire: Each day, at drop off, parents will be asked a series of questions about their child's health. Before a child will be allowed to enter Florida Oceanographic Society property, parents will have to verbally confirm that their child's temperature has been taken that morning and is lower than 100.4 degrees. Parents will also have to confirm that their child is not experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19 and has not come into close contact with anyone suspected of having COVID-19. If a camper develops symptoms of COVID-19 during a camp day (cough, fever, etc.), they will be sent home early. If symptoms persist, the camper will be asked to skip the next day of camp. Although Florida Oceanographic Society does not typically offer camp refunds in the event of unexpected illness, in cases where camp days are missed due to documented COVID-19 symptoms, we will offer a prorated refund.
